5 key facts of immigration detention

- Who gets detained and why, where and how many
- There is no time limit on immigration detention, anomaly in Europe. Terrorist suspects can be detained up to 14 days.
- It is not judges but the Home Office who decides whether someone should be detained. You can apply for release (bail) from inside, but many people are refused.
- Many problems with conditions & access to services exist, but detention centres are more accessible in the UK than other countries and are regularly monitored by independent bodies whose reports are publicly available.
- The government is planning to expand the detention estate, despite that the parliamentary inquiry into detention not even finished. (The Detention Forum is calling for a moratorium on the detention expansion join us! More info here http://detentionforum.org.uk/call-for-a-moratorium-on-the-detention-expansion-stop-campsfield-expansion/)
